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the series awareness social sciences for classes vi vii and viii is based on the syllabus as specified by ncert for the latest sessions the syllabus has tried to link the academic curriculum with real life and thus dwelled on connecting the students understanding with the real world around them accordingly this book has incorporated real life examples case studies story lines and narratives which could be immensely helpful in assimilation and to inculcate interests among the students significantly

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drawing on social science conversations at a lively café in bristol this highly original book explores the value of public engagement in a wider social science context the chapters range from themes such as the dialogic character of the social sciences pragmatism in responses and the underpinnings of managerial approaches to the restructuring of higher education the first part reflects upon the different social and political inflections of public engagement it is followed by chapters based upon talks at the café that were concerned with public engagement and the contribution of social science to a reflexive understanding of the dilemmas and practices of daily life together the contributors offer a refreshing look at the role of social science in the societies it examines

first published in 1986 social science and social policy addresses major questions concerned with the social utility of social science the book is divided into four parts the first part considers the place of social science in the policy making process and criticizes the rational model which gives a central place to analysis in part two five different methodologies for policy research are considered the use of continuous surveys public opinion polls social indicators evaluation research and social experimentations and the use of

qualitative methods the advantages and drawbacks of each are considered with extensive use of examples in the third part the role of theory is examined particular attention is paid to the issue of health inequality in part four general questions are raised about the use and abuse of social science including questions about how it can be most effectively disseminated to make maximum impact the book is aimed at a general readership and requires no special methodological expertise it will appeal particularly to undergraduates and graduate students taking courses in social policy public policy applied sociology and a range of applied social sciences such as criminology health studies education and social work

this study explores the flow of information within and among academic disciplines in the social sciences and humanities through analyses of the patterns of scholarly book reviewing an elite sample of scholarly monographs published by university presses between 1971 and 1990 was used beginning with derek de solla price the measurement of communication within the disciplines of science has been ongoing in the present book that field of inquiry is summarized and provides a basis for examining the flow of information in the social sciences and humanities
